
Policy

NSS conducted its 2009 Legislative Blitz on Capitol Hill in Washington, DC, meeting with over 100 congressional offices. NSS also maintained a Political Action Network for stimulating responses to policy issues related to the goals of NSS.

Space Contests and Awards

NASA Ames Research Center in conjunction with the National Space Society conducted its annual space settlement design contest for 6-12th grade students. In 2009 NSS established Bruce M. Clark, Jr., Memorial Scholarship, which will start in 2010. The top individual entry will receive an extra award of \$2,000 by the NSS. NSS also honors individuals and groups who have made significant contributions consistent with the Society's mission of creating a spacefaring civilization. These include the NSS Awards for Excellence for individual volunteer efforts in service to the Society, the Space Activist of the Year Award, and the NSS Chapters Awards.




Financial Summary
